## Vedic math for SAT/ACT preparation for students

Vedic Math Academy (VMA) will offer free informational events and diagnostic test in the Greater Chicago area to educate students and parents about vedic math and its benefits on Saturday May 3rd at 4:45 p.m a session at Yamunotri Chinmaya Mission, 30877 N Fairfield Road, Chinmaya Mission, Grayslake will be held. This session is a dual session with Hindu Swayamsevak Sangh -organizers of 'Kaun Banega Ramayan Expert Contest' providing information on this upcoming contest.

The other session will be conducted on Sunday May 4th 11:30 a.m, at Sri Venkateswara Temple of Greater Chicago, 1145 W. Sullivan Rd, Aurora and Sunday May 4th 2:30 PM, at Chinmaya Mission-Chicago, 115080 Route 83, Willowbrook.

VMA has designed two programs: SAT/ACT Prep using Vedic Math (Ages 13-17), and, Math Enrichment using Vedic Math (Ages 8-12). Programs will be offered in an intensive one weeklong or weekend workshop

format during summer. A separate, semester (Fall/Spring) format is also offered in the academic year, but during weekends. VMA currently has centers in Detroit Metro area (a joint project with Hindu Swayamsevak Sangh) and has opened an office in Algonquin to serve the Greater Chicago community.

Sree N. Sreenath, Ph.D., Director of VMA, and architect of the VMA syllabus, explains that Vedic Math is an easy to learn, simple to use, quick mental computation method that is suitable for all ages. "In a globalized, competitive world, a difference of twenty points in SAT could mean a world of difference – a difference between admission to an Ivy league school and tens of thousands of dollars in scholarship money," opines Prof. Sreenath. With twenty five years of teaching experience, Prof. Sreenath is also a faculty member at the Electrical Engineering and Computer Science Department and the Director of Complex Systems Biology Center at Case Western Reserve University, Cleveland, Ohio.
